

Dr. Nicholas Kilkenny, bass-baritone, is a classical vocalist and voice professor located in Western New York. Most notable roles include Méphistophélès in Faust with Buffalo Opera Unlimited, Dulcamara in L'elisir d'amore with Houghton Lyric Theater, Sacristan in Tosca with Nickel City Opera, Bartolo in Le nozze di Figaro with Eastman Opera Theater, Frank in Die Fledermaus with Geneva Light Opera, among others. Recent concert performances include Handel's Messiah with the Buffalo Philharmonic, Fauré's Requiem with Orchard Park Chorale, Vaughan Williams'

Dona Nobis Pacem with Nazareth College, Bach's Christmas Oratorio with the Eastman Philharmonia, and a full performance of Schubert's Schwanengesang in recital at Eastman. He made his Carnegie Hall debut in 2014 singing the role of Jewel Scrooby in Howard Hanson's Merry Mount with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra. Nicholas is currently on faculty at the Crane School of Music, Houghton College, and Nazareth College, teaching applied voice and independent studies in vocal pedagogy and lyric diction. Upcoming engagements include Dulcamara in L'elisir d'amore with Buffalo Opera Unlimited, Narrator in Into the Woods with Cobblestone Players (Farmington, NY), and Bartolo in Le nozze di Figaro with Geneva Light Opera.

Michael is thrilled to be part of this performance as it achieves something to which he has aspired since college, a split recital with his friend Nick. Michael earned his Bachelors Degree from Buffalo State College where he studied vocal performance, music composition, and film. Notable roles include King Triton in the Town of Manlius production of The Little Mermaid and Walter in Absence of Mind, an original musical produced entirely by Buffalo State College students and written by Michael S. Larkin. As producer, composer, and lead vocalist, Michael was part of

a nationally touring ska-fusion band that earned two Syracuse Area Music Awards in 2006. With contributions in music composition, voice acting, and audio engineering, Michael was part of the Full Cast Audio team that won Audiophile Magazine's 2009 Earphones Award for excellence in audiobook production. Applying his skills as a singer, arranger, conductor, and multi-instrumentalist, Michael spends much of his time as a Music Director here at St James. When he's not engaged in musical pursuits, he enjoys being an on-air personality for Galaxy Media and lives in East Syracuse with his wife Danielle and their daughter Sofie.
